The vacancy is offered in conjunction with the University of Liverpool's School of Veterinary Science.

Project Description

- This is a 3-year, full time, veterinary anatomic pathology residency programme with training towards the European College of Veterinary Pathology (ECVP) board specialisation.
- This training post provides an opportunity for a veterinarian interested in zoo animal and wildlife pathology case material (70%) but also will feature a significant domestic species component as well (30%).
- You will undertake veterinary pathology training on a range of species but with the emphasis towards Chester Zoo cases. You will also contribute to the small group veterinary undergraduate teaching and undertake a small collaborative research project.
- The position will prepare you for the ECVP and / or RCPATH certifying examinations.
- You must have an RCVS registrable veterinary degree and must have at least one year experience as a veterinarian in a field relevant to veterinary pathology.

The successful candidate will:

- Hold a veterinary degree eligible to practice in the UK.
- Be eligible for ECVP board examinations as stipulated by the European College of Veterinary Pathologists (ECVP).
- Have a passion to pursue a career in veterinary pathology, with particular reference to exotic animals, wildlife or zoological collections.
- Have experience in teaching veterinary undergraduates
- Have experience in veterinary pathology
- Have specific awareness of aspects of veterinary pathology concerning exotic species
- Have experience in laboratory-based research and publishing novel peer-reviewed manuscripts
- Have a track record of publications in international peer-reviewed scientific journals.
